

From the

I recently spent some continuing ed time at the Institute for Liturgical Studies at Valparaiso University. It was a wonderful three days filled with worship and learning, meeting new people and reconnecting with some old friends whom I had lost track of over the years. In terms

with some old friends whom I had lost track of over the years. In terms of content for the speakers and workshops, the overarching theme was centered around the question of how we mark time in the church, while creating and sustaining community in a time where the sense of community seems fractured, and a sense of isolation increasing. A lot of discussion hovered around things that we are already working towards as a parish, namely being open to intersecting with folks who may only darken the door a couple times a year, if then, or have a vague idea that at certain points in life, you go to the church and the church does something to give shape and meaning to things like Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals etc. At these times and in these practices, the Llturgy itself serves to create community as we are drawn together, and drawn out of ourselves toward something larger. Within this practice of liturgy (the work of the people in worship together) the Sacraments create touchstones to remind us of that connectedness. There was some discussion around streaming services and whether or not that was community as well, and how we can connect better with those folks; the Jury is still out on that, but it is clear to me that anything that extends invitation, and draws people into community, even if only occasionally, is a good thing indeed. This is of course, an extremely broad overview of hours of presentation and discussion; I have copious notes I would be happy to share. I am grateful for your support of this time away.





SOUTH WALNUT CHURCH

"The first officers were Jeppe Skow; Christian Skow; Niels Jensen; Peder F. Gylling, first Secretary; and Christian Henningsen, Treasurer.

On June 6, 1892, the group met to incorporate the congregation in order that it could legally receive and own property. Jens and Lars Olesen donated 2 acres of land to be used as a cemetery. June 14, 1892, the Articles of Incorporation were recorded. The trustees were Knud Thuesen; Christian Henningsen; and Henry Brown.

The building committee collected \$800 and built a church, the present church, at a cost of \$761.53, leaving a small balance of \$37.47 in the building fund. Henry Brown was the architect. The church was finished in 1893 and dedicated Aug. 20, 1893, by Rev. P.C. Trandberg."
